CHAPTER 2. ADMINISTRATION

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Sec. 2-1. Form of government.

In accordance with the referendum held on Tuesday, October 23, 1984, under the provisions of Chapter 44A of Title 11, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended, the city hereby changes its form of government and adopts a mayor-council form of government with the mayor elected at large and a five-member council elected from single-member districts.

Sec. 2-2. Council districts.

- (a) The five (5) districts shall be designated and numbered numerically, and said districts and boundaries shall be as set forth in Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached to the ordinance from which this section is derived, and made a part hereof by reference.
- (b) Except as specifically noted on Exhibit A and other than the corporate limit lines, the boundary line between districts is the centerline of the street dividing the districts.

Voting places for each district are hereby designated and established as follows:

Sec. 2-4. Candidate qualification fee.

- (a) A qualification fee in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50.00) is hereby fixed and imposed upon all candidates seeking election as mayor, except as hereinafter provided for.
- (b) A qualification fee in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50.00) is hereby fixed and imposed upon all candidates seeking election as council members, except as hereinafter provided for.
- (c) Such qualification fee shall be paid to the city clerk and deposited to the general fund of the city at or prior to the time of taking out qualification papers by any such candidates.
- (d) Any person desiring to qualify who is not financially able to pay the required fee may qualify provided such prospective candidate furnishes the clerk with an affidavit stating that he is financially unable to pay the required fee fixed by this section.
- (e) This section is adopted pursuant to section 11-46-2, Code of Alabama 1975 and shall be effective in all elections, general and special, for the aforesaid offices from and after the date of the adoption.
- (f) The official ballot shall not contain the name of any candidate who has not paid the qualifying fee, as herein provided.

Sec. 2-5. Elections to comply with state laws.

General and special municipal elections, held in the city, shall be conducted in a manner pursuant to the provisions of the Code of Alabama.

Sec. 2-6. Compensation and benefits of mayor.

- (a) *Salary.* The salary of the mayor of the city, shall be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of forty-eight thousand dollars (\$48,000.00) per year.

- (b) *Automobile.* The mayor shall be furnished an automobile for use in connection with his official duties.
- (c) *Retirement.* The mayor shall be entitled to all retirement benefits for which he is eligible, if so enacted by the state. The city shall pay contributions owed to the retirement system in accordance with state law and in accordance with city personnel policies and procedures.
- (d) *Health insurance.* The mayor may be included in the city group health insurance plan, and that cost shall be paid by the city.

Sec. 2-6.1. Mayor to act as utility superintendent; duties; salary.

- (a) The mayor of the City of Troy, Alabama, Jimmy C. Lunsford, is hereby required to act as the superintendent of the City of Troy utility system, and as such shall serve as purchasing agent for such system, make all purchases authorized by the City of Troy council, keep a check on meter reading and billing for service and collections thereof, see that the system is kept in proper repair and operation, keep an inventory showing the supplies and equipment on hand for such system, keep a full and complete monthly financial statement of all operating costs and receipts, keep a proper inventory of the physical assets of such system, and have all such data and information relative to such system available for the city council on its first meeting in each calendar month.
- (b) In addition to the salary now fixed and paid to the mayor of the City of Troy, Alabama, there shall be paid to the mayor for his services as superintendent of the utility system named in subsection (a), herein the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) per pay period, payable out of the receipts of such utility system.

Sec. 2-6.2. Salary of council members.

The salary of the council of the city, shall be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) per pay period. Pay period shall be the same as that of the employees of the city.

and that cost shall be paid by the council members.

AN ORDINANCE
SETTING QUALIFICATION FEES
ORDINANCE NO. 31

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROY,
ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A qualification fee in the amount of \$50.00 is hereby fixed and imposed upon all candidates seeking election as mayor of the City of Troy, Alabama, except as hereinafter provided for.

Section 2. A qualification fee in the amount of \$50.00 is hereby fixed and imposed upon all candidates seeking election as council members of the City of Troy, Alabama, except as hereinafter provided for.

Section 3. Such qualification fee shall be paid to the city clerk and deposited to the general fund of the city at or prior to the time of taking out qualification papers by any such candidates.


Section 4. Any person desiring to qualify who is not financially able to pay the required fee may qualify provided such prospective candidate furnishes the clerk with an affidavit stating that he is financially unable to pay the required fee fixed by this ordinance.

Section 5. This ordinance is adopted pursuant to Section 11-46-2 of the Alabama Code of 1975 and shall be effective in all election, general and special, for the aforesaid offices from and after the date of adoption.

Section 6. All ordinances, resolution or orders or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.





That the City of Troy code, Chapter 2. as amended, is hereby amended as follows:


SECTION 1. By striking and deleting Section 2-3 and replacing with the following:


